## Rishi Sunak- An Ideal

Despite having a descent family background and a respectable school, Rishi served as a waiter at a curry house at Southampton during his holidays. Sunak had been interested and passionate about politics and social welfare from the very start and had possessed a subtle quality of leadership and mentoring.

He graduated with a wide range of subjects like Philosophy, Politics and Economics from the Lincoln College, Oxford, with a first in 2001. Along with his course at his University, he undertook an internship at Conservative Campaign Headquarters which provided him with great experience in his field. In 2006 he did his masters in Business Administration from the Stanford University, where he was a Fulbright Scholar.

Sunak grew up in a medical-science background where most people's expectation from him were for him to become a Science or medical student. His approach towards his work wasn't affected by his parents' occupation. Instead of following the family hierarchy, he went on to set an admirable example for all young people out there who often take up their parents' or family profession because of social pressure or simply because they fear to stand out. Sunak's life journey as a student, a son, a politician and as a social servant is an outstanding specimen which remarks that "Chasing dreams are everyone's right."

## DEMOLITION OF TWIN TOWERS

Apex and Ceyane- the two 100 metre supertech twin towers of Noida were demolished at 2.30 pm on August 28, 2022 as per a Supreme Court order that found their construction in violation of norms such as fire safety, building codes and minimum distance requirements. They were brought down by a massive blast. The explosives were triggered and the towers fell within seconds. The demolition of the towers was an immense havoc resulting in tonnes of dust and debris.



Destructions like this are bound to have a major effect on the environment and the surroundings. The explosion produced a large amount of smoke leading to air pollution which further raised concerns for the residents regarding its impact on health. The towers were located in a residential neighborhood with large greenery. The dust submerged nearby trees and vegetation. Apart from the health and environmental impact, the demolition incurred a huge economic loss. A large amount of money was used in the construction which was wasted within seconds. Looking at the repercussions, one can't help but feel that it was necessary to avoid the demolition as it did not only cause severe economic loss but also effected the environment and residents' surrounding.
