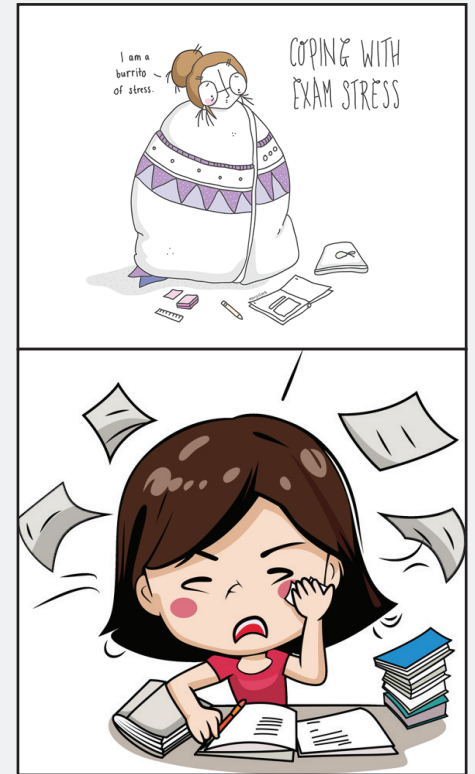
Why Exams Should Not Decide a Student's Future

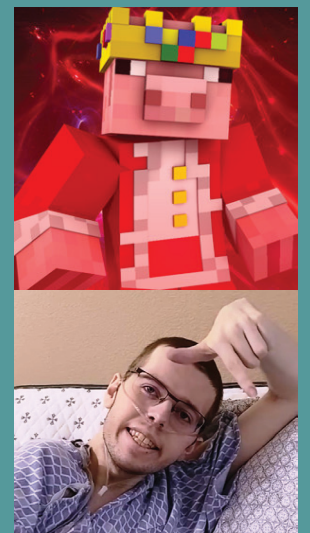
