Why I Enjoy Doing Maths*

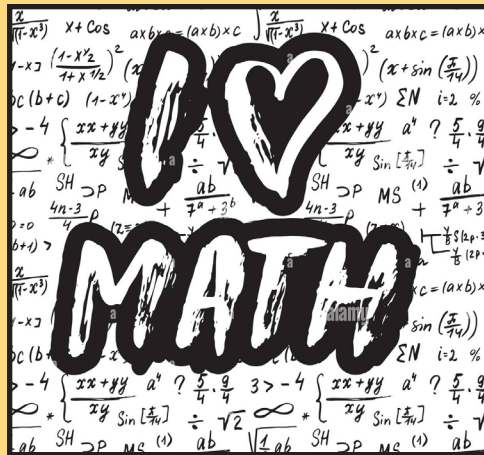
I really enjoy doing Maths as it's my favourite subject. It is the subject which does not require any theoretical learning. It is truly based on calculations and a single formula
