A PERSONALITY TO ADMIRE- DRAUPADI MURMU

In a parliamentary democracy, like India, presidential elections do not attract much media and public attention. This is due to the fact that the President of India is a nominal executive head of state and does not exercise much power. However, as B.R. Ambedkar puts it, "he (the President of India) represents the nation... he is the symbol of the nation."

The election polls were scheduled to be held this year on 18th July. The UPA had chosen Yashvant Sinha and the BJP-led NDA had chosen Draupadi Murmu as their presidential candidate. Draupadi Murmu, born in the Santali tribal family, served as the first woman governor of Jharkhand from 2015 to 2021 and became the

first person to complete the 5-year term. Moreover, she is the second person belonging to a scheduled tribe to be nominated as a candidate for the post of President of India. She was a teacher by profession before entering state politics in 1997 and became a councilor for the Rairangpur Nagar Panchayat as a BJP member. In 2007, she was awarded the Nilkantha Award for best MLA by Odisha Legislative Assembly.

People are applauding the decision of nominating Murmu as she comes from a marginalized background. She has become a great source of inspiration and strength for people belonging to the scheduled tribes and women all across the country as



she has broken barriers of the society regarding class, tribe and gender. Everyone sincerely hopes and wishes that during her tenure she emerges as one who upholds the democratic rights and aspirations of people from all sections of the society and works for the betterment of people.

PUBG Mobile gamers in India like Mortal,

A huge chunk of the revenue for gamers comes through advertisements on their content, features such as Super Chats and Super Stickers, and sponsorship agreements or brand deals which makes it a financially stable field and a great upcoming career choice.

Four things you should definitely buy while shopping in Nainital

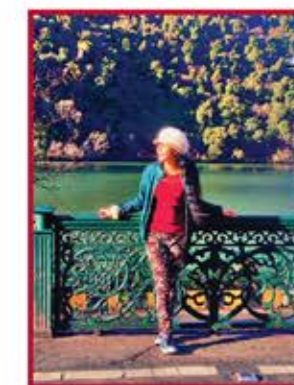
- **Fancy Candles**

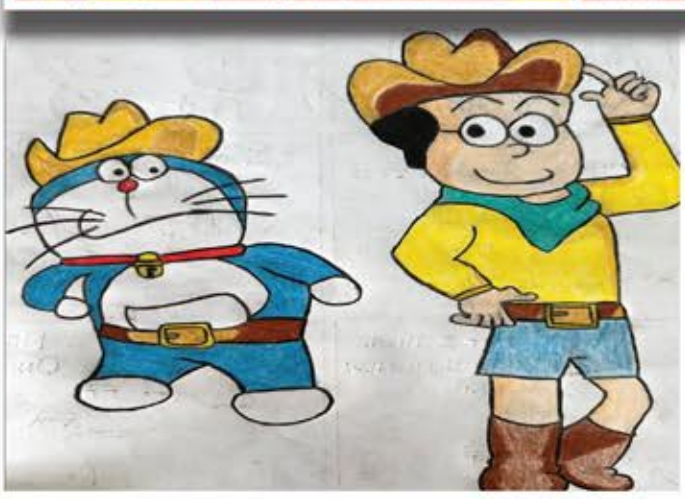
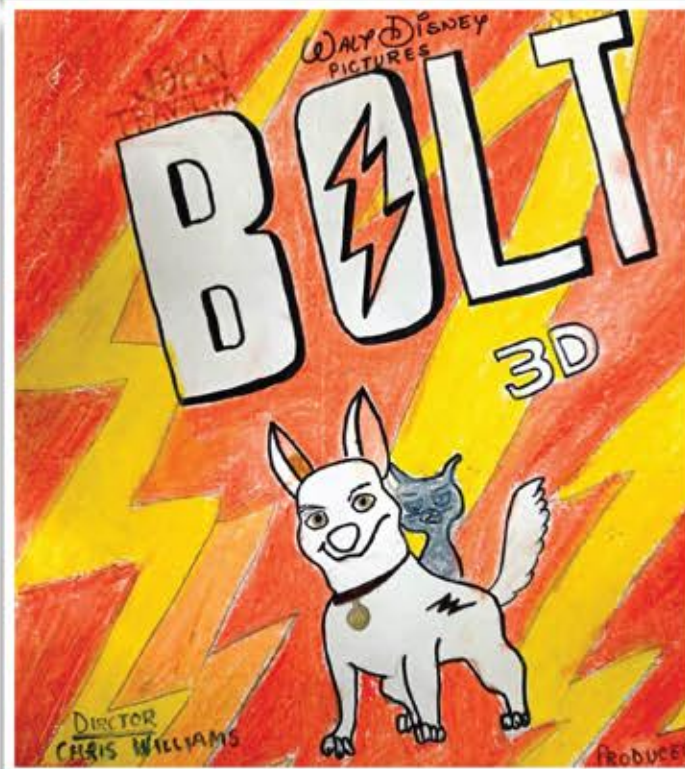
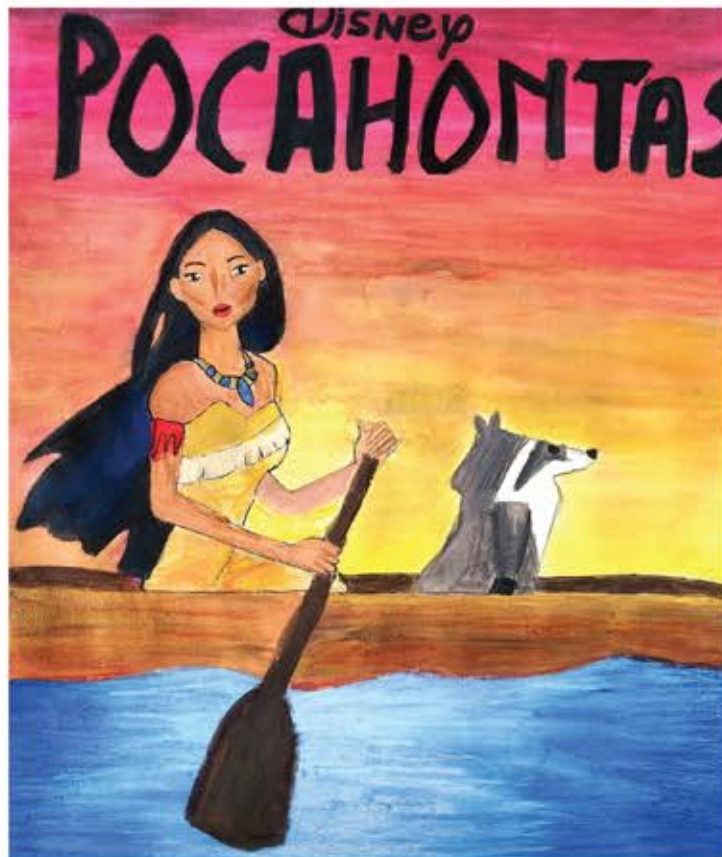
Though the historic setting is certainly a dynamic force throughout the novel, it cannot compete with the commanding presence of Scarlett O'Hara.
